

Call for Applications to Pursue a Doctoral Degree at the University of Turku Graduate School, Doctoral Programme in Technology (DPT)

In this call for applications, you can apply for the right to study for a doctoral degree in the Faculty of Technology or at the Turku School of Economics of the University of Turku Doctoral Programme in Technology (DPT). Please read more specific instructions below and apply on 14 March 2025 at the latest.

Short description of the doctoral programme

The Doctoral Programme in Technology (DPT) operates in the disciplines of natural sciences (biosciences, computer sciences, and industrial engineering and management), technology (automation and electrical engineering, biotechnology, information and communication technology, materials engineering, mechanical engineering, and industrial engineering and management), and humanities (phonetics). A Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree can be completed in following major subjects: biochemistry, food chemistry, industrial engineering and management, molecular biotechnology and diagnostics, molecular plant biology, phonetics, or computer science. A Doctor of Science in Technology (DSc (Tech)) degree can be completed in following major subjects: automation and electrical engineering, biotechnology, food development, sustainable biotechnological processes, information and communication technology, materials engineering, mechanical engineering, or industrial engineering and management. A degree of Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) or Doctor of Science in Economics and Business Administration (DSc (Econ & Bus Admin)) can be completed in the major subject of information systems science. Application period and what can be applied for

During the application period **3 – 14 March 2025** (the call closes at 4 pm, local time in Finland), you can apply for the right to pursue a doctoral degree at the University of Turku at the Faculty of Technology or at the Turku School of Economics (Information Systems Science as field of research) at the Doctoral Programme in Technology **from 1 August 2025 onwards**.

What is expected of you

- You are required to have completed a relevant Master's degree awarded by a university or a university of applied sciences, or a relevant study programme abroad which in the awarding country gives eligibility for the corresponding level of higher education (Universities Act 558/2009, 37§). In the Faculty of Technology the degree which grants the applicant the eligibility for the study right for a doctoral degree must be completed within the application period, or after the application deadline on the condition that the applicant graduates and submits a scanned degree certificate and a transcript of study records to the University of Turku email tech-doc@utu.fi by 31 July 2025. When applying for Information Systems Science at the Turku School of Economics, the degree that gives eligibility for the study right for a doctoral degree must be completed at the latest on 14 March 2025.
- You must fulfil the <u>University of Turku language skill requirements</u>.
- You are required to fulfil the prerequisites set by <u>the Faculty of Technology</u>, or <u>the Turku School</u> <u>of Economics</u> for granting a right to study. For more information, see the section "Assessment of applications".

How to apply

The right to study for a doctoral degree is applied for by filling in an electronic form in My Studyinfo service and attaching the required additional documents (documents attached into the electronic application form must be in pdf-format). The form will be accessible as the application period begins on 3 March 2025 and closes on 14 March 2025 at 4 pm (local time in Finland). Application documents are specified at the end of this call for applications (Appendix 1) and on the website of the doctoral programme. A link to the website where the instructions for the application will be published. It is recommended that application documents are written in English. All of the required attachments must be submitted before the end of the application period. Applications that arrive after the application period has ended will not be processed. The application documents will not be returned to the sender.

During one application round the applicant may apply to a maximum of two doctoral programmes at the University of Turku. You can only have one valid study right at a time for a doctoral degree at the University of Turku. When the application period has ended, you cannot change the doctoral programme you are applying for, or any other information.

Evaluation of applications

Applications are reviewed by the steering committee of the doctoral programme. Also external experts from outside the University of Turku may be consulted. If needed, the applicants can be interviewed. The research plans attached to the applications may be checked with the Turnitin OriginalityCheck plagiarism detection software in accordance with the University of Turku quality assurance system.

Admission criteria

In addition to the eligibility criteria related to the right to pursue a doctoral degree (Universities Act 558/2009, 37§) and the required language skills, also the educational and research-related merits, the quality of the research plan and its feasibility in the planned schedule, and the research potential based on the application documents are used in the evaluation and selection of doctoral researchers. In the selection process e.g. applicant's motivation, merits and completed studies will be taken into account. The admitted applicants must have a good knowledge of the English language. The research topic of the doctoral researcher must fit the profile of the doctoral programme.

New doctoral researchers have to agree on the supervision arrangements with the department in question before submitting the application (Supervision plan form). According to the Rector's decision each doctoral researcher must have **at least two supervisors**. One supervisor acts as the main supervisor.

At the Faculty of Technology, a doctoral researcher has to be appointed at least two qualified supervisors and a research director. The faculty may appoint only one supervisor for a doctoral researcher based on application and for a valid reason. A supervisor must have completed a doctoral degree, and at least one of the doctoral researcher's supervisors must be a professor (professor, associate professor or assistant professor) or an adjunct professor. In the Faculty of Technology, one of the doctoral researcher's supervisors has to be employed by the University of Turku or be docent (adjunct professor) of the University of Turku. A person eligible for research director is an employee of the Faculty whose title is Professor.

At Turku School of Economics, the following principles are followed in the selection of doctoral researcher's supervisors: 1) At least two supervisors are appointed for each doctoral researcher, both of whom must have a doctoral degree, 2) one of the supervisors must be a member of TSE's teaching and research staff; 3) the principal supervisor is at the third stage of the researcher career or is on an equivalent level in scientific merit, and is an active researcher and publisher, 4) active scientific research activities are also required from the second supervisor and other possible supervisors.





If the applicant does not submit a signed supervision plan that meets the faculty supervisor requirements as an attachment of the application, the application will be rejected.

At the Faculty of Technology, in order to be accepted as a doctoral researcher, applicants are required to have been successful in their prior studies. If the field of the Master's degree (or equivalent) differs from the field of research of postgraduate studies or there are other shortcomings in prior studies, knowledge and skills may be required to be supplemented to achieve a sufficient level. The appointed research director of a postgraduate student gives a statement in the supervision plan on the possible need for so-called bridging studies.

- If the success of the applicant in the prior studies is not sufficient, a research director must take a stand in the supervision plan if bridge studies are needed.
- If the applicant does not hold a previous degree in the field of research they are applying for, a research director must take a stand in the supervision plan on possible bridge studies.
- There can be maximum 30 ECTS of bridge studies. Bridge studies cannot be included in postgraduate studies of 40 ECTS.

NOTE: The selection criteria for postgraduate studies at Turku School of Economics are used in the selection for applications to the right to pursue a doctoral degree in Information Systems Science. Decisions

The (Vice-)Dean of research affairs of the Faculty will decide on granting the right to study for a doctoral degree, based on the proposals of the steering committee of the Doctoral Programme and the statement from the department. All applicants will be personally informed about the decisions by 30 May 2025.

An admitted applicant has to notify the University of Turku of their acceptance of the study place by 13 June 2025 at 3:00 pm (local time in Finland) according to the instructions given in the admission notification. If the admitted applicant does not give the notification by the end of the allotted time period mentioned above, the applicant forfeits the study place. A person admitted to more than one university or polytechnic degree programme only notifies the one educational institution at which they choose to accept the study place. Notification, i.e. accepting a study place, is binding and may not be cancelled or changed later.

According to Finnish legislation, student may accept only one study place leading to a higher education degree in Finland during one academic term (autumn term 1.8.-31.12. or spring term 1.1.-31.7). This rule applies to all higher education. Higher education degrees included in the rule are Bachelor degrees and Master degrees awarded by Finnish universities of applied sciences, Bachelor degrees and Master degrees awarded by Finnish universities and Licentiate and Doctoral degrees awarded by Finnish universities. Only exemptions are Transfer student selections, the Åland Polytechnic and the Police College of Finland.

All students pursuing a doctoral degree must register for each study term as instructed by the University of Turku. Only students who have registered as being present can participate in the teaching and pursue studies at the university.

The applicants who have completed their prior degree in a country other than Finland and who are granted a study right in this call, need to deliver either the original degree certificates or certified copies of the original degree certificates and their translations to the University of Turku, as instructed in the admission notification, on 5 September 2025 at the latest. If the admitted applicant does not deliver the required certificates by the deadline, they forfeit the study right. <u>Instructions on delivering certificates and country-specific requirements</u>.

Appendix 1. Application documents

Please fill the electronic application form on **My Studyinfo** and attach the required application documents with it, if not otherwise stated. The application documents should be in pdf-format. Attachments that do not meet these requirements may be rejected.

<u>In addition to</u> the electronic application form, documents 1-5 and possibly documents 7-9 must be submitted. In addition, document 6 is recommended to be submitted.

1) Curriculum vitae

2) Dissertation research plan (in English) (mandatory)

In the Faculty of Technology, the <u>maximum</u> length of the research plan in all is 5 pages (Times New Roman 12pt or equivalent; line spacing 1). Research plan should contain:

- Name of the applicant
- Planned title of the doctoral dissertation
- Description of research topic and scientific goals
- Research methods, experimental design and research environment
- Placement of the dissertation research in a possible wider research context of the group
- Timetable of research
- Current state of doctoral thesis and postgraduate studies.
- List of references

For applicants in Information Systems Science the maximum length of research plan is 10 pages, and cover and list of references. The research plan should follow the guidelines for the responsible conduct of research (see Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR) | Finnish National Board on Research Integrity TENK). By attaching the research plan to the application form the applicant gives permission for checking the research plan with Turnitin Originality Check (system for electrical plagiarism detection). The use of artificial intelligence (AI) to assist in the preparation of the research plan in a wider role than checking grammar or generating short expressions should be clearly indicated in the research plan.

3) A copy of the degree certificates and the transcript of study records (mandatory)

- **A.** If you have completed your <u>former degree at a higher education institution in Finland</u>, you must attach to the application:
 - Scans of the original degree certificate or the electronic degree certificate of the degree which make you eligible for doctoral studies (e.g. Master's degree certificate)
 - Scans of the original transcript of records or the electronic transcript of records of the degree which
 make you eligible for doctoral studies (e.g. transcript of records of the Master's degree)
 - Other educational documents which may be of relevance in the student selection (e.g. studies you have completed outside the degree that are related to the right to study you are applying for).

- **B.** If you have completed your <u>former degree(s)</u> at a higher education institution abroad (i.e. outside of Finland), you must attach to the application:
 - Scans of the original degree certificate or the electronic degree certificate of the degree which
 make you eligible for doctoral studies (e.g. Master's degree certificate in the same language as
 the degree was completed in)
 - Scans of the original transcript of records or the electronic transcript of records of the degree which
 make you eligible for doctoral studies (e.g. transcript of records of the Master's degree in the same
 language as the degree was completed in)
 - Other original educational documents which may be of relevance in the student selection (e.g. studies you have completed outside the degree that are related to the right to study your are applying for).

If the original degree certificate, transcript and/or other educational documents are not written in English, Finnish or Swedish, official translations to one of these languages must also be submitted. An official translation here refers to a translation of the educational documents issued by the awarding institution or a translation made by an authorized translator. A transcript or degree certificate in English can be replaced by a Diploma Supplement awarded by a European educational institution if it contains the information about completed courses and other study attainments.

Those applicants who have been granted a right to study and who have completed their prior degree abroad have to submit either the original degree certificates or certified copies of the degree certificates and other educational documents and the official translations of the documents to the University of Turku at the latest in 5 September 2025. If the admitted applicant does not deliver the required certificates by the deadline set in the admission notification, they forfeit the study right. <u>Link</u> to the instructions on delivering certificates and country-specific requirements.

C. In the Faculty of Technology: If your former degree is not complete by the end of the application period, an up-to-date transcript of study records is required.

Please make sure that all attachments are good-quality, easy to read, full colour scans or photographs of the complete required document. Attachments that do not meet these requirements may be rejected.

If you have completed the former degree(s) which make you eligible for doctoral studies at a university abroad (i.e. outside Finland), please make sure to have original degree certificates and other relevant educational documents ready at hand if you are granted a right to study. Instructions will be given in the admission notification.

4) Supervision plan signed by the supervisors, the applicant and a) a research director (Faculty of Technology) OR b) the subject's Professor in charge (Information Systems Science, Turku School of Economics)

A supervision plan is a mandatory attachment of the application. Please find the supervision plan form (note: different templates for the applicants in the Faculty of Technology and Turku School of Economics) on the website: https://www.utu.fi/en/research/utugs/dpt/admission.

5) Motivation letter (mandatory)

Motivation letter is maximum one page long freeform document, which includes the reasons for performing a doctoral degree in the Doctoral Programme in Technology, and also your career plans after graduation (e.g. with regards to academic career / in Finland or elsewhere).





6) List of publication

7) Verification of language proficiency (possibly mandatory, check below)

The University of Turku follows the Rector's decision (15 August 2019) on the means of verifying one's language proficiency. If the applicant is required to prove their language proficiency with a language test, a scanned certificate of a completed language test must be attached to the application. 8) Copy of a valid passport (possibly mandatory, check below)

Attach a copy of your valid passport or official identification card with photo and information on citizenship. If you have a Finnish personal identity code and you have entered it on the application form, you do not need to attach a copy of your passport.

9) A statement of continuous commitment by a company/organization (outside UTU) to an employee's doctoral degree (potentially needed, check below)

A freeform document, in which a company / organization (representative of a company / organization, e.g. superior) express of being aware of the applicant's post-graduate studies and shows support (e.g. level or type of support, possible resources) for applicant's studies while the applicant works at the same time at the company / organization. The commitment should express also the impact of the thesis work for the company / organization.
