- Workshop: we will edit and discuss an example paper together
- Discussion: how can better writing skills increase the impact of my work on the scientific community?

Course overview:

As scientists and doctors, most of our work is carried out in labs and clinics. However, we are periodically required to present and publish our work; this involves a particular skill set that is often overlooked in training programmes. This short course is designed to improve your writing skills and to enhance the impact of your work on the scientific community. The course will be run as a live half-day event, entirely in English. The course leader is Steve Smith, a native English speaker with over 25 years' specialist experience as a Medical Writer and Editor. Before the course day, you will be asked to complete and return a short (1-hour) preparation task, which will be supplied after you register.
