- One of the three EC2U joint masters in collaboration with several European universities
- The only Master of Arts (MA) degree
- The only one with à la carte structure
- Students will be able to personalise their curriculum: they will choose their study plan in accordance with the course catalogue provided by the universities they'll be studying at.

Multilingual, multicultural, multidisciplinary

An international master's degree programme European Languages, Cultures and Societies in Contact (120 ECTS)

- Embraces languages and cultures from the perspective of diversity
- Trains language professionals for a multilingual and multicultural work environments

After completion of the master's degree, you will be able to

- Work as an expert in European languages, language diversity and cultures for industry and for local, national and international bodies
- Conduct high-profile research in language and culturally related topics across Europe and to proceed with a PhD programme



Programme structure (120 ECTS)

30 ECTS compulsory courses

- On theoretical and methodological questions of contact and diversity
- Shared teaching as series of lectures, online and in English

60 ECTS elective courses

- Courses on linguistics, foreign language learning, literature, cultural and societal studies, digital humanities...
- Onsite teaching in the national or other European languages

30 ECTS Master's thesis

Co-supervised by two professors at two different partner universities




At least two degrees from two countries

The programme has a very international character

- At least two semesters must be spent at one or more partner universities (up to four partners)
- You will get a master's degree by all the universities where the minimum national academic requirements have been achieved (usually 30 ECTS)

EC2U for students – an active alliance

Students have the possibility to establish connections, network, and participate in international events

- EC2U Forum once a year
- Summer/Winter Schools
- Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP)
- Virtual Institutes
- Entrepreneurship Academy and Entrepreneurship Week



For short mobilities, students can apply for a EC2U grant to cover the costs of travelling



Requirements

Bachelor's degree or a degree corresponding to 180 ECTS

 A degree in a relevant field of studies: linguistics, applied language studies, European languages/foreign languages, modern philology, translation, culture, history, international relations or other branches of the social sciences and humanities

Proficiency at a B2 level in two languages

- French, German, Italian, Portuguese, Romanian, Spanish + English as a lingua franca (no level required, except for Turku, C1)
- If starting in Turku: German or French + English



Attachments

You must provide the following documentation to one of the partner universities

- Bachelor's degree
- Transcript of records
- Proof of required language skills
- Curriculum vitae
- Letter of motivation in one of the following languages: English, French, German, Italian, Portuguese, Romanian, Spanish

Application period at the University of Turku

• 8 January – 22 January 2025

Publication of rankings of candidates eligible to enroll


By 30 March 2025

Acceptance of study place

Deadline in July 2025

Enrolment (registration)

Deadline in August 2025





EC2U student fees and scholarships

The student fee is 1500 € per academic year = 750 € per semester

- Includes local fees, legal liability insurance, library and laboratory costs and any other mandatory cost related to the students' participation in programme
- The tuition fees will be paid each semester to the university where the student will attend 30 ECTS
- The student fee will be reimbursed to EU/EEA citizens (minus the local fees)

Students can apply for the **Erasmus+ mobility grant** when completing mandatory semesters abroad in the partner universities
