Longstanding Board member, Anne Kumpula, who also led TIAS prior to my joining retired in 2023 and I would like to pay tribute to her work for TIAS and her assistance to me. Our Visiting Professor in Mentoring, Ulrika Maude, continued to support our Fellows and the wider university community in myriad ways. My thanks to her. Senior Research Fellow Georges Kazan continued to work for TIAS on dedicated projects and yet again thanks are due to him for his dedication and hard work.

We also benefitted from a visit by Professor Robert ("Bob") Frodeman, an expert in Interdisciplinary working. Bob's visit was funded by the Fulbright Foundation and saw him help to introduce our new TIES Programme (see page below) and he also undertook a review of our activities, which will prove useful for future planning. He also gave a special lecture entitled "[A complete mismatch? The production of knowledge in the modern University](#)" at the Turku Main Library in September. This questioned the role of universities in the modern world and provided much food for thought. Overall, Bob made a number of important contributions during his stay with us and thanks are due to him.

Bob was also a key participant in our 15th Anniversary event which was held in the Kakola Great Hall in Turku in October. This saw our Fellows gather together with representatives of a range of external organisations, including those from

some of our Nordic IAS partners. We were delighted to have Professor Jo Shaw of the University of Edinburgh as our keynote at this event. Jo was the Chair of the external review panel which reviewed TIAS as part of the University's Research Assessment Exercise (RAE) in 2023. The title of her keynote was **"The role of IASs in meeting global academic challenges"**. We also welcomed Professor Keijo Virtanen, who was Rector at the time of foundation of TIAS and offered his thoughts on the motivations behind that formation. TIAS Fellows led two panels which discussed Artificial Intelligence and Human Diversity. Overall, the day provided a great example of TIAS' commitment to interdisciplinary working and thus a suitable way to celebrate our birthday. Thanks to the ongoing support of the Kone Foundation, we were able to continue to offer places to displaced scholars as part of our commitment to the Scholars at Risk (SAR) programme which we were in the privileged position of being able to undertake. A highly significant development for TIAS was start of the new [Turku Intersectoral Excellence Scheme \(TIES\)](#), which is partly funded by €1.14M from the Marie Skłodowska Curie Actions COFUND scheme and involves the development of an exciting new Fellowship path. Following an international recruitment process we recruited eight Fellows (of whom six are international) and the new Fellows joined on 1 September 2023. For more details see page 11 below.

Together with our colleagues from the Turku Collegium for Science, Medicine and Technology (TCSMT) we conducted another [series of public lectures in the Turku Main Library](#). This activity is a key part of our knowledge exchange activities and saw eight of our Fellows present their work.

We welcome the opportunity to collaborate with colleagues from within and beyond the University and continue to look forward to hearing from you.

► TIAS Mission and Profile

Founded in 2008, Turku Institute for Advanced Studies (TIAS) works across the faculties of Economics, Education, Humanities, Law and Social Science within the University of Turku to foster internationally excellent interdisciplinary research. TIAS is a joint enterprise between the faculties of Education; Humanities, Law, and Social Sciences and the Turku School of Economics.

TIAS funds its Fellows to undertake three-year research projects. The general Fellows represent two different career stages: postdoctoral and mid-career (collegium). Postdoctoral Fellows are able to advance their professional competence after recently being awarded their doctorates. Collegium Fellows have the opportunity to develop the competence required for more demanding research posts or other expert positions after the postdoctoral period. The new Turku Intersectoral Excellence Scheme (TIES) programme recruits Fellows within eight years of their PHD. In addition to their salary, TIAS Fellows receive €3,600 per annum (2024 figure) towards their research costs.

TIAS Fellows are selected via an annual international open competition. For the 2023 intake the TIAS Board of management decided to organise a Call for only the TIES programme. This Call for applications was open from November 2022 to January 2023, with up to eight positions available. Ultimately eight appointments were made and successful applicants began their TIES projects in September 2023.

In 2023 the TIAS research community consisted at various points of a total 34 Fellows: 13 Collegium, 13 Postdoctoral and eight TIES. In addition to Fellows, TIAS staff in 2023 comprised of the Director: Professor Martin Cloonan; Co-ordinator: Dr Jenni Kankaanpää, Controller: Markus Piippo; Senior Research Fellow: Georges Kazan and Visiting Professor in Mentoring: Ulrika Maude.

In 2023 TIAS appointed four Research Assistants to work with its Fellows. Virpi Kivioja, Daria Kosinova, Tiago Queimada E Silva and Roosa Tuukkanen began working with us from 1 September and we were delighted to welcome them in to the TIAS family.

The Institute holds regular meetings for its Fellows, providing the opportunity for them to interact with one another and present their work in a collegial and interdisciplinary environment. In 2023 Fellows presented on a diverse range

of topics including emotional and cultural mapping, motherhood and Finnish film. We also held discussions on topics such as Life After TIAS, research ethics, academic boasting and mentoring.

In addition to supporting its Fellows in their projects via the provision of research allowances and continuing professional development activities, TIAS also hosts a range of events designed to appeal across disciplinary boundaries. In 2023 this included an event on Finnish Democracy Now in the run up to the parliamentary elections and an [event on Social Class](#) held in conjunction with colleagues from the International Institute for Popular Culture.

We also held [online seminars which introduced our new Fellows to the wider world](#). In August we held another grantwriting workshop where grants in progress were subjected to peer review. We welcome enquiries about the co-hosting of events which are likely to appeal to audiences drawn from across out constituent faculties.

► Turku Intersectoral Excellence Scheme (TIES)

[Turku Intersectoral Excellence Scheme \(TIES\)](#) marks a key stage in TIAS' development. Supported by 1.14M € funding from the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) COFUND programme, one aim of the programme is to mix the traditional Institute for Advanced Studies (IAS) model of bottom-up research with intersectoral working. TIES Fellows spend part of their Fellowship on secondment with an organisation outside of higher education. We are excited at the prospect of working more closely with partners within and beyond Turku in the coming years in developing the secondment programme. This will include a regular series of events which will examine the nature of intersectoral working between higher education and organisations outside of higher education. Georges Kazan wrote an excellent bid which resulted in the funding of this programme which we were delighted to receive. It will make a significant contribution to our activities in future years.

► International Activity

TIAS continues to be an active member of the University-based Institutes for Advanced Study (UBIAS) organisation and attended its Directors' meeting in Nagoya in 2023.

We also continued to attract international visitors and applicants for TIAS positions. The new TIES programme resulted in us recruiting eight new Fellows of whom six were international (and the rest Finns returning to the country). We continued to support and facilitate international visits by our Fellows. This will be expanded in 2024, by the introduction of a Fellow exchange programme with our colleagues in NordIAS, the [Nordic Institutes for Advanced Studies network](#).

The formation of the NordIAS network was a direct outcome of the [Beyond Advanced Studies workshops](#) which were led by TIAS and funded with a grant from the Joint Committee for Nordic Research Councils in the Humanities and Social Sciences (NOS-HS). The workshops were held between November 2021 and May 2022 and, amongst many other things, saw attendance by all the Directors of Institutes for Advanced Study (IAS) in the Nordic region. Discussions at the workshops led to a commitment to consider ways for the Nordic IASs to work together. In 2023 the members of NordIAS signed an agreed Memorandum of Understanding and met together again in Aarhus. This exciting development would never have happened without the dedicated work of Georges Kazan who was responsible for the vision and funding of the Beyond Advanced Studies workshops. The Nordic IASs have much to thank him for.

► Scholars At Risk

Scholars at Risk (SAR, <http://www.scholarsatrisk.org/>) is an international network which seeks to support scholars facing repression in their home countries and to support academic freedom. Since 2018 TIAS has been leading SAR activities in the University. Work in 2023 included receiving continuing funding to from the Kone Foundation to support the development of work focused on the crisis in Ukraine. TIAS continued to host displaced scholars and was honoured to do so.
